From the Pastor's Desk...

The end of our lives is not something most of us enjoy thinking about. Yet if we are gifted with a good and — perhaps long — life, there is much meaning to be made of the season that surrounds our death. Our faith teaches that because of our relationship with Jesus Christ, we have nothing to fear. Even though we may still hesitate to think about death, we entrust ourselves to God in life and in death.

Our book study at the end of September focuses on the challenging issues that surround questions of life and death.



What makes for quality of life when a person is sick? What mark are we seeking to leave on the world? What does it mean if our lifespan, which we had expected to be longer, is cut short by illness? What does God have to do with it all? Even if you missed the discussion, I recommend to you both of the books we read (When Breath Becomes Air by Paul Kalanithi and Everything Happens for a Reason, and Other Lies I've Loved by Kate Bowler) to help you dig deeper into your own answers to these questions.

At the close of our *A Good Life* worship series, our church is hosting a workshop entitled, "We Belong to God" focused on end of life planning on Sunday, October 10 at 11:30 am in the Kirkman Fellowship Hall. I urge you to attend, no matter your stage of life. Invite a friend who might benefit from the discussion, too. We sometimes think such planning is only for senior citizens. But if COVID has taught us anything, it is that life is precious and it's good to be prepared whether we are 35 or 85 years old. At the workshop, Joseph Jackson and I will spend some time talking about how our church seeks to accompany families through their grief and the funeral service. We'll offer practical planning resources to share with your family and loved ones to communicate your desires for your eventual funeral, as well as other items they may need upon the event of your death. Also at the workshop, a number of community service providers will be present to share a bit about their work and to help you get more acquainted with their resources. William Sullivan Funeral Home, Michigan Cremation Society, Grace Hospice, and the Alzheimer's' Association will be present, along with an attorney who specializes in wills and trusts. You can get information and then contact these providers on your own to utilize any of their services.

I am also celebrating that, this past month, our church enrolled another Sunburst Steward, who has designated a gift to the church's endowment in their estate. The Sunburst Steward program was unveiled a year and a half ago. I'm pleased that we have already enrolled five Stewards who are living lives of faithfulness and generosity and will leave that legacy behind them at their death.

As we look ahead to All Saints Sunday, which we will observe on November 7, I give thanks for all the saints in our church — those in the church visible (those here now) and in the church triumphant (those who have died and claimed God's promise of resurrection life). When we live, we live to the Lord and when we die, we die to the Lord, scripture tells us. We receive each day as a gift. So, let us live wholeheartedly to the Lord, for the Lord, and with the Lord, in this community of faith.

powerful witness of that love through a gift to the church.



We are so excited to be back in person for Sunday school. Each week we explore what it means to be a follower




