

From the Pastor's Desk...

Dear church members and friends,

At the end of April, the Session received and acted on recommendations of the Sustainability Task Force, which was created to reduce our church's growing annual deficit and set us on surer financial footing. The Task Force was appointed in November 2019 and included Krispen Carroll (chairperson), Kevin Ball (secretary/reporter), Adair Calder, Ron Coleman, Anne-Marie Devantier, James Hanks, Scott Kortlandt, Kevin Schnieders, and myself.

The elders were thorough in their questions and discussion of the report and acted with faithfulness and wisdom in responding. Of the measures approved, the most significant is that Session voted to eliminate the position



of Associate Pastor. Concurrent with this decision, you can read the letter from Rev. Pam Meilands in this newsletter which details her acceptance of a call to Derry Presbyterian Church in Pennsylvania, pending a vote there in June. We will hold a congregational meeting on May 31 to vote on her request; her last day with us will be June 14, 2020. We have been so grateful to Pastor Pam and her ministry with the youth. We will continue to minister to our youth and connect with them and their families through this season of change. In the next few weeks, you will also hear more about Pastor Pam's transition and how we can send her into her next call with God's blessings.

Another significant change will be a reduction of the Mission and Benevolence annual budget by approximately 50%. This reduction is substantial and will change the way we support local, national, and international missions. However, the Mission and Benevolence Committee has already been working to help us re-shape our focus on hands-on mission opportunities, allowing us to continue our service to God in the community. The Session also considered and adopted several other Task Force recommendations. These include the following:

- To change the Chancel Choir soloists' contracts to a 10-month contract from a 12-month contract, beginning in August 2020. The Music staff are preparing for this transition in the coming year and looking for ways to invite the gifts of youth, instrumentalists, and other church members into our worship as we experience this change.
- To sell the Hendrie Blvd. parking lot north of the church to a residential real estate developer, subject to congregational and Presbytery approval. The lot is little used but requires maintenance and upkeep expense. The Task Force recommends that the sale proceeds be devoted to facilities maintenance and capital repair and improvement expenses.
- To form a sub-committee to investigate and make recommendations as appropriate to establish a child day care facility at the church.
- To develop and implement an updated schedule of rental fees for church facilities.

The Session approved other changes to the operating budget beginning in August 2020 totaling \$18,670. Together, these changes will result in savings of \$126,980.85, which are essential to moving us toward a more sustainable financial position. The Session also received recommendations on specific practices to increase financial transparency in our church's accounting and financial statements.

I, and members of the Task Force, are ready to speak with you about the specific questions you have surrounding these decisions. Challenges, transitions, and times of change can reveal who a community really is. The Task Force's work and our experience during the pandemic shows me that our community comes together in gratitude, love, and shared ideas. You, and the leadership of the church, have cared for one another so well, shared your feelings and vulnerabilities, and continued to serve God through this time. For this, I cannot express my gratitude enough! I am confident in the future and our congregation's place in it. God is always inviting us into new things and God promises to go with us through all endeavors.

Congregational Meeting May 31

A Congregational Meeting has been called for Sunday, May 31 at 11:30 am via Zoom telephone and video-conferencing for the purpose of: 1) electing church officers; 2) requesting that the Presbytery of Detroit dissolve the pastoral relationship between the Rev. Pamela Meilands and FPCRO, effective June 14, 2020, on Rev. Meilands' request in order that she may accept the call to Derry Presbyterian Church in Derry, Pennsylvania; and 3) declaring the position of Associate Pastor at FPCRO closed. Details for attending the meeting using your telephone, smartphone, tablet, laptop, or computer with camera and microphone are below. All appropriate safety features for Zoom have been enabled. In the event it is legal and advisable to hold the meeting in person, you will receive further instructions for doing so at the church at the same date and time. If you have questions about connecting to the meeting, please call the church and leave a message for Pastor Emma at ext. 206.

To join with audio/telephone only using any phone, dial +1 312 626 6799. Then punch in the Meeting ID and Password (below) when prompted.

Zoom software limits us to the participation of 100 devices for the meeting. We urge all member couples and families to log-on using a single device to allow the participation of others. In the event that we exceed our limit, a second congregational meeting session will be hosted at 12:30 pm the same day. Any members prevented from logging in to Zoom at 11:30 am should log in at 12:30 pm on May 31 in order to participate.

Letter from Pastor Pam Meilands

April 22, 2020

Friends,

Over these last few months, both our church and I have gone through a time of great discernment. The session appointed a Sustainability Task Force, from which the session received a final report last night. Around the same time, I began the search for a new call. Pending a candidating service and congregational vote, which is currently scheduled for June, I will be starting as the Associate Pastor for Children, Youth, and their Families at Derry Presbyterian Church in Hershey, Pennsylvania. My last day in the office, so to speak, will be May 31. It is with both joy and sadness that I share this news with you.

One of the recommendations of the Sustainability Task Force is to reduce staffing costs at FPCRO by becoming a solo pastor congregation. While I officially learned of this recommendation in late February, I knew that this would be a likely outcome of the task force's work. Many churches about the same size of FPCRO are finding themselves in situations like ours and making similar decisions and, so, when the task force was first announced, I knew it was time to start circulating my PIF (Pastoral Information Form - the equivalent of a resume for a PC(USA) pastor).

In March, I was offered the call at Derry Presbyterian Church. While the transition process is being delayed by stay-at -home orders, this new position offers an opportunity for significant growth and will provide new and exciting challenges for me. The church and community are also closer to home - about two hours from where my parents live.

This is bittersweet news to share. Over the past five and a half years, I have come to love Michigan and the people of FPCRO. However, I know that this is God's next step for me and I am confident in God's desire to keep FPCRO a thriving worshiping community into the future.

Transitions are difficult in even the best of times and, unfortunately, these are not the best of times. I ask for your grace and prayers for the church, the staff, and for me as we navigate a change like this during a pandemic and know that you are all in my prayers as well.

LITTLE FREE PANTRY


