

From the Pastor's Desk...

In April of 2020, the church staff imagined that we'd be back to worship in a few weeks and we would sing the *Hallelujah Chorus* together to celebrate! Well, obviously things didn't work out that way! Nevertheless, we are so grateful to be coming together for in-person worship this summer starting on June 6. I want to be sure you're up to date on how you can attend our services feeling confident and safe. If you have any questions, please call or email me to talk! It is my goal and the Session's goal that as many people as possible can attend worship and that everyone can do so comfortably.

9 am Sanctuary service:

- To attend this service on a particular Sunday, register ahead of time. Registration opens on Friday morning, May 28 for the service on June 6; and on Monday morning for the following Sunday for subsequent weeks. Go to our website, www.fpcro.org, and click on the red button for the 9 am service, which will take you to the registration page. Or, you can call the church during office hours (M 9 am-3 pm; T-F 9 am-1 pm) to reserve a spot. If you leave a voice mail, note that your registration is not confirmed until you receive a call back. Registration will remain open until all 60 available spots are filled, with a few spots reserved for visitors. To ensure that everyone who wants to worship in the sanctuary has an opportunity to do so, we ask that if you attend the service one week, you wait until Thursday to register for the following Sunday, allowing others to make their reservation Monday through Wednesday.
- Watch the video (<https://vimeo.com/551929085>) on the general safety procedures for attending the indoor service before you come to worship. Enter the building only through the Christian Education lobby entrance where a staff member will note your registration. Then proceed to the sanctuary where ushers will guide you to a pew, seating the congregation from the front to the back. Offering plates will be located at the doors and ushers will dismiss each pew at the end of the service.
- Wear your mask throughout your time inside the building and please do not attend if you are feeling under the weather.
- Remember that this service will always be livestreamed and your image may appear online if you are in attendance.

10:30 am Outdoor service:

- There is no limit on attendance at this service and registration is not required.
- Bring a lawn chair or blanket to sit on if you're able. If you can't do that, we are happy to get you a chair!
- There will be a Time with the Children. Following that, Ms. Joelle will take the children to the playground area for a story and outdoor play while the worship service concludes.
- Most weeks, we will follow the state guideline that masks are not required in outdoor gatherings of less than 100 people. So, you can remove your mask if you are comfortable or you can wear your mask if you prefer. Please remember to practice social distancing and stay home if you are feeling sick.
- Once a month, we will have a SINGING SUNDAY! On these weeks, everyone in attendance will be required to wear a mask so that we can sing the hymns aloud in a safe manner together. The first Singing Sunday will be June 20 – so that day, wear your mask! Other Sundays, the soloist will offer sung music for the congregation.

Communion:

We will partake of communion at both the indoor and outdoor services on the first Sunday of the month. The bread and cup will be pre-packaged and worshippers will pick up the elements before the service begins. Masks will be removed briefly to eat and drink the elements. A gluten-free option will be available.

Livestream:

Watch the livestreamed 9 am service on our Vimeo page (click the light blue V on our website) or our Facebook page (click the darker blue F on our website) at 9 am on Sundays. *Or anytime later in the day/week.* If you access the service on the Facebook page, you may need to scroll down until you see the post for the service. Anyone can view the service on Facebook, whether or you have a Facebook account yourself. Call the office if you have any trouble finding or accessing the service — we want to help!






Annual Notice to Electronic Givers:

We thank you for your continued support to FPCRO. About 33% of our pledging congregation and 39% of all our pledge dollars, about \$197,400, will come in through electronic giving during 2020-21. Thank you!

A few points to remember:

- At the start of this new fiscal year, your gift will continue to be deducted in the same manner as requested on your ACH request form.
- If you turned in a pledge card, the new amount will be reflected starting in the withdrawal after August 1.
- If you didn't turn in a new pledge card, the amount will remain the same as the ACH Request form or the last pledge card received, including your per capita payment preference.
- Per Capita payments, if you so authorized, will be taken in your first withdrawal in September during our Focus on Per Capita campaign.
- Special gifts options, if you so authorized, will be taken in your first withdrawal in the month of the selected holiday.
- If your chosen withdrawal date lands on a weekend or banking holiday, your gift will be withdrawn on the next business day.
- You can change, suspend, or terminate your electronic giving option by giving seven day advance written notice to the church administrator.

Book Study


